




















Additional uses of change detection

Statewide Medical Marijuana Licensing Info:

- 388,240 Active Patient licenses (10% of Oklahoman population)
- 2,274 dispensaries licensed (530 in Oklahoma County 23% of state)
- 8,247 growers licensed
- 1,461 processors licensed
- 11,982 TOTAL LICENSES ISSUED
- All 77 counties
- Oklahoma is #1 in number of dispensaries in the nation.
- Oklahoma is #2 in dispensaries per capita

As of November, Oklahoma added more cultivation licenses in 2020 than any other state. California was a close second.



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
Five states dominate

More licenses were issued in August than any other month in 2020.



THIS PROJECT: What have we found?



- 10% Completion (14,000 accounts)
- 1,639 accounts with a new improvement
- **Market value increase of: \$40,135,738 from 2020 2021

**NOTE: Market value change is not solely attributed to newly detected structures. Other influences such as market increases may have attributed to the overall increase from year to year.



County assessor's are currently using this technology to help identify changes to property characteristics as required by statute. This is in addition to the current requirement of <u>on-site</u> visual inspection.






